### **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

CITY ADMINISTRATOR

Ms. Bailey announced that the official Ground Breaking Ceremony for the KY 16 Reconstruction Project will take place on Monday, June 11, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. at the end of the cul-de-sac on Morning Glory Drive. Ms. Bailey invited all the residents to come out to the Ground Breaking. Ms. Bailey also announced that Governor Beshear, Senator Thayer, Representative Kerr, Representative Simpson and members of the Kenton County Fiscal Court as well as the City of Taylor Mill Commission will be in attendance.

#### FINANCE

Mayor Bell reported that the budget is in good shape. A financial summary can be found on our website.

#### MAINTENANCE

Commissioner Kuehne stated that road repairs are in progress and encouraged residents to call the office if they have a repair on their road that needs to be fixed. Mr. Roden reported that the big dirt pile at the park was donated by Ft. Mitchell. Mr. Roden plans to use the dirt to cover some piping and to fill in the pond at Pride Park. The Commission agreed to fill in the pond at Pride Park as long as it isn't a storm water retention pond.

Commissioner Kuehne encouraged the residents to walk at the park. Mr. Kuehne also announced that the City saved a lot of money on salt this year and that the City will not have to purchase or store the 100 tons of salt per the Kenton County contract. Ms. Bailey thanked Mr. Schrieber for his efforts in not having to purchase the salt.


#### PARKS & RECREATION

Commissioner Kreimborg reported the trails at Pride Park are marked with signage showing distances and encouraging quotes. Commissioner Kreimborg announced that the movie, Zookeeper, will be shown at Pride Park on June 8, 2012 with activities starting around 7:00 PM. Commissioner Kreimborg also stated that the Recreation Department is selling Flag Kits for \$15 and they can be purchase at the city building.

#### POLICE

Commissioner Reis reported that the new cruiser will be ready in a few weeks. This cruiser will replace Lt. Wilson's cruiser. Commissioner Reis stated that the Kenton County Swat Team will be at the June 8, 2012 Friday Night Flicks at Pride Park to display equipment and promote the Explorer program. Chief Knauf said that the Department of Defense and Secret Service in connection with the Kentucky State Police are donating a Humvee to the City at no cost. This vehicle will be used for area searches, in climate weather and as a PR tool for the Explorer and NEAT programs. This vehicle should be ready by the Homecoming Parade.

There being no further business, Commissioner Kuehne made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Reis made a second. All were in favor. The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
