The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Commissioner Kreimborg gave the invocation, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Bell. The Assistant to the C.A.O. called role:

GUESTS:

Senator Chris McDaniel thanked the Commission for allowing him to address the Commission. Senator McDaniel gave brief update on some of the bills that were passed and some that did not get passed at this year's General Assembly Session. Some of the bills that were passed that Senator McDaniel touch upon were:

- SB1 –Military Absentee Ballot
- SB8 –School Safety Training on dealing with shootings and evacuations
- SB15 –when officers are killed in the line of duty, tougher sentences for perpetrator
- SB61 & 64 –Kues money for early graduates
- HB1 & HB7 –financing projects for schools
- HB8 –Drug control
- HB217 –Pill Mill Bill
- SB13 –alcohol sales on Election Day
- SB2 – Pension Reform

Commissioner Kuehne asked if there was any discussion about gun control or the I-75 Bridge. Senator McDaniel explained that there wasn't much discussion about those topics due to the other more pressing topics on the docket.

Ms. Bailey said she had heard something about allowing for coyote hunting and is concerned about the possibility of weapons being discharged within the city limits. Senator McDaniel explained that that pertained more to farm and rural areas.

Mayor Bell asked about the distribution of transportation funds, indicating that it seems that more dollars are given to the rural areas than to the likes of cities. Senator McDaniel confirmed that that is a correct assumption and he would like to see this issue address by redistricting, which he hopes will happen at next year's General Assembly Session.

Senator McDaniel also said he wants to push the Angel Tax and Prevailing Wage bill at next year's General Assembly.

Commissioner Kuehne asked if there was going to be a special session this year to discuss any of the bills that didn't get passed. Senator McDaniel said it cost a \$60,000 a day for a special session and that it is highly unlikely that the Governor would call for a special session this year.

LEGAL COUNSEL –No report

MAINTENANCE –Commissioner Kuehne informed the Commission that the maintenance department has been working on the roads, picking up trash and getting the park ready for summer. Mr. Roden said that he is installing some culvert pipes in the creek at the park so that he can access the back side of the park with appropriate equipment.

Commissioner Kuehne encouraged the residents to use caution when driving Old Taylor Mill Road due to the amount of construction going on with the KY-16 Realignment Project. Mayor Bell also urged the residents to use caution and patience when driving during the construction period.

PARKS AND RECREATION – Commissioner Kreimborg announced the City Wide Yard Sale Event will be held on May 17 & 18, 2013 from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM. Permits cost \$2.00. The City has a Shred Event scheduled for April 27, 2013 from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM.

POLICE – Commission Reis said Chief Knauf is working on the police department’s budget proposal for next year and that he is also taking progressive pictures of the KY-16 Construction Project. Commissioner Kuehne informed the residents that they can sign up for a vacation watch by visiting the police department’s web-site or by calling the police department office.

Mayor Bell said his newsletter will be sent out early next week.

Mr. Eversole asked when the Commission was going to blacktop Fairview. Ms. Bailey said that would have to be discussed at the MRA meeting in May. Ms. Bailey said we don’t know how much money the City will receive from the MRA Contract and that the Commission has already committed to repaving some streets in the North end of the City in conjunction with work being done by SD1 and NKWD.

Commissioner Murray made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Kuehne made a second. All in favor, aye. The meeting adjourned at 7:45 PM.
